The Guild is to celebrate the artistic skills of members through the 2010 photographic award.

Good photography has taken on new significance as a means of portraying subject matter in an interesting but and informative manner as articles in farm and countryside magazines compete for readers' attention with other forms of media.

The Guild Photographic Award recognises the very best pictures that provide a visual record of agriculture, horticulture and the rural environment in general.

Members may enter up to three images in each of the following categories:

People
Livestock
Crops
Landscape

All images entered will be displayed on the [Photographic Award](#) page of the Guild website to illustrate the depth and breadth of subject matter. Entrants short-listed will be asked to submit high-resolution versions plus proof of publication for final judging.

How to enter

Send up to three images per category in digital .jpeg format approximately 12" x 8" at 150dpi to the [GAJ Photo Competition](#) email address giving the following details:

- 1: The photographer's name, address and contact number.
- 2: The filename of each image and its title.
- 3: Details of where and when the image was published.
- 4: The category in which it is entered.

Images must have been published in print during 2009; should be submitted as-published and not manipulated other than for light and colour balance; and be the sole work of the entrant. Composite images are not permitted.

Images entered for other Guild or IFAJ awards are not eligible.

Entrants will retain copyright but, as a condition of entry, give permission for their images to be displayed on the Guild website and at Guild and other events.

Entries must be received by **5pm, Monday, February 15.**

Awards

Framed certificates will be awarded to the winners of each category with the overall winner receiving a certificate and perpetual trophy at an event convenient for the winning entrants.
